This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students in the Upper 2 Bands Naplan 2017.
Year 3 students: Target: 35% Reading; 35% Writing; 35% Spelling; 35% Grammar/Punctuation; 15% Numeracy
Year 5 students: Target: 30% Reading; 18% Writing; 30% Spelling; 30% Grammar/Punctuation; 20% Numeracy
- Increase NAPLAN Student Relative Gain from Year 3 - Year 5 to 95% for all Strands.
- Increase NAPLAN Year 3 and Year 5 Writing NMS to 95%
- Increase the percentage of students at or above stanine 4 Pat R comprehension
Year 4: 78% at or above stanine 4
Year 5: 80% at or above stanine 4
Year 6: 63% at or above stanine 4
- Increase the number of students (P-6) at or above PM Benchmarks to 90%.
- Increase the number of Prep-Year 3 students at or above Words Their Way benchmark to 80%
- Increase student attendance to 95%
- Increase teachers involvement in professional learning communities and targeted professional development sessions to 100%
- Increase recording of positive behaviours on OneSchool for all students across the school
- Continue to build teacher confidence in implementing Digital Technology curriculum
- Increase automaticity of number fact recall
- Increase student use of problem solving strategies in Maths



Investing for Success

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Continuing to fund the Gifted and Talented Program by funding an Extension teacher for one day a week to provide programs for high achieving students. **\$14 000**
- Continuing to provide parenting skills information to the school community. **\$600**
- Continuing to fund a Lower School Learning Support Teacher three days a week to work with students in the early years who require targeted and intensive intervention. **\$42 000**
- Continuing to fund a Lower School Literacy Coach two days a week to further build teacher capacity to analyse student data to inform teaching and learning, track data and deliver Professional Development. **\$28 000**
- Continuing to fund a Speech Language Pathologist up to 1 extra day per week to provide Oral Language focused support programs for identified Prep & Year 1 students with significant speech delays. **\$8 000**
- Continuing to provide focused explicit teaching of Literacy skills in ability groups through funding extra paraprofessionals. **\$60 000**
- Continuing to fund a Before School Reading Club facilitated by paraprofessionals for students identified as below DDSW benchmarks. **\$14 000**
- Continuing to fund *Literacy Pro* Reading Program. **\$5 000**
- Purchasing PAT M and PAT R online tests and provide PD to teachers on data analysis. **\$2 025**
- Continuing NAPLAN preparation for upper 2 bands via IMPACT online courses - Yr 3 (7 students) Numeracy – Solve-it (Booster series) and Yr 5 (7 students) Critical Thinking (Unify series). Round 1 – Jan–May. **\$3 780**
- Providing air conditioning to 7 mainstream classes to improve behaviour and academic outcomes. **\$8 000**
- Increasing the funding of a behaviour support coach to two days a week to assist with PBL implementation. **\$28 000**
- Building a high performance leadership team (Pete Stebbins). **\$5 000**
- Continuing to fund an IT coach and provide teacher release time 1 day a week to support teachers to implement Digital Technology curriculum and STEM initiatives. **\$14 000**
- Continuing to fund the Restart program run by PCYC for students with recurring or long term school suspensions. **\$6 000**
- Further improving FHS Showcase as a way of engaging with parents. **\$500**
- Maximising teacher aide hours as per the EB Agreement to enable our Priority Learning Areas to be supported. **\$40 000**
